



**Results of the Primary Election Indicate Banner Year for Alabama Republicans**

An emerging field of impressive legislative candidates, an exciting gubernatorial runoff that will keep conservative Republican principles and ideas in the headlines, and a Democrat nominee for governor who campaigned with convicted felons and expressed strong vocal support for "Obamacare" are all positive signs for the ALGOP!
